HSE launches asbestos campaign



This month's safety campaign focuses on asbestos. Although we have had an asbestos awareness campaign previously there is currently a huge push on the topic by the HSE. The HSE have updated all of the information available on its website which includes (wait for it).... videos that are not from the early 90's! It's the news we have all been waiting for, and rest assured the new videos have found themselves within the CSS asbestos awareness training course!

Asbestos is still responsible for around 5,000 deaths in the UK each year and is a significant hazard in the construction sector. Use the safety campaign information to ensure that all those involved in projects are aware of the hazards of asbestos and that they have received the required training.

Temporary Works





There are many elements of temporary works in construction, these fall under various pieces of legislation and are required to be managed. Temporary works provide a solution to items such as access/egress, site hoardings, protection of falls, and stability of structures.

Within smaller construction projects it is sometimes not considered or understood what is required to ensure compliance. All temporary works fall under categories 0-3 ranging from simple to complex, but all must have a design solution in place. This is covered under Stability of Structures under CDM and Temporary Works B5975. Where temporary works are also in place to assist in working at height, or the prevention of a fall, they will also fall under the Work at Height Regs.

Examples of common temporary works are;

- Heras fencing this will require the fencing to be installed to manufacturer guidance/manual and if you differ from this will require an independent design.
- **Propping** this can range from basic to complex, but all require a design and inspection regime by a competent person.
- Edge protection/guard rails/scaffolding all fall under temporary works and other requirements which require a design to be in place, and an inspection regime by a competent person.
- Safety netting ranges in complexity depending on what it has been tied to and the fall distance needed below.

Remember all temporary works require a design and inspection by a competent person!
